

ASBESTOS AWARENESS

Asbestos and Health

Asbestos must be inhaled in order to be a health hazard; there has been no evidence to suggest that ingestion will cause any ill effects. There are several diseases associated with asbestos exposure.

It is important to be aware of the health risks associated with asbestos exposure when asbestos may be present in the work place.

Chrysotile - Serpentine

- classified as a serpentine asbestiform mineral
- commonly known as 'white' asbestos, fibres may be green, gray, amber or pink
- over 95% of the world's asbestos production
- fibres have high tensile strength, good flexibility, good spinnability, and high resistance to caustics

Crocidolite - Amphibole

- straight needle-like fibres
- Amphibole fibres can easily become airborne

Amosite - Amphibole

- straight needle-like fibres
- Amphibole fibres can easily become airborne
